In every Film Skills module, you work with new people and new preconditions. On completion of this module, you will have expanded your portfolio with various designs, research results, interim products and final products.

- through short skills assignments, to deal with time pressure, the strengths and weaknesses of your own design
 process and the set preconditions;
- to apply the in-depth knowledge you have gained in the areas of storytelling, visual storytelling, auditorial storytelling and applied storytelling within a limited duration;

- to identify and analyse various film skills and design methods and use them in the design and production process;
- to use knowledge and visions of writing techniques, cinematography, editing and directing within a short time;
- to use (basic) knowledge and skills regarding script, decoupage, performance direction, art direction and montage, etc.;
- to draw up a premise and interpret it in an audiovisual world with a central theme, subject and perspective.
