Content 1

The project consists of four intensive skills seminars that focus on your hands-on development in part of the IMT toolkit.

You come into contact with – and practice with – various skills and techniques that are important in visualising, designing and executing ideas.

You work with skills and techniques that contribute to the possibilities of professionalising the design process. The following subjects are addressed:

- Working with sensors and interaction
- · Experimental design
- · Working with projection, lighting and spatial sound
- Working in various 'realities' (Augmented, Virtual, Extended reality)

The skills seminars are supported by a Context & Theory subject about experimental film. It introduces you to various forms of narrative and experimental forms of film, to provide inspiration for the assignments in the skills seminars.

Learning objectives

Project 5 comprises four 2-week skills seminars that focus on the following learning goals:

• Sensor Lab: Working with sensors;

You are introduced to the use of sensors and applications of computer code to create generative and interactive visual and audiovisual work.

• Experimental design: Designing material and technical research;

Through 'creating by doing', you investigate how to create visual work in a completely different way, based on material research and allowing chance in your work.

• Studio Projection: Images in space;

Using projection, different surfaces and sound reproduction, you investigate how to give your visual and audiovisual work a strongly spatial character.

• Altered Realities: Basic principles of working in Augmented and Virtual Reality;

You are introduced to technologies with which narratives can be told and visualised in physical and non-physical spaces, in Virtual, Augmented and Mixed reality.

The skills seminars are supported by a Context & Theory subject about experimental film. It introduces you to various forms of narrative and experimental forms of film, to provide inspiration for the assignments in the skills seminars.
